Paper Recycling (Blue Bag #1)

-  Intact/shredded paper
-  Cereal, cracker, pasta & frozen food boxes
-  Tissue boxes, envelopes
-  Newspaper, flyers & magazines
-  Paper egg cartons & drink trays
-  Paper gift bags, tissue paper, wrapping paper

You don't have to remove plastic windows from envelopes or tissue boxes.

Recyclable Containers (Blue Bag #2)

-  All plastic containers & bags
-  milk, creamer & condiment containers
-  peanut butter, Nutella containers
-  shampoo & laundry detergent bottles
-  yogurt and sour cream containers
-  All glass jars
-  metal & tin cans
-  All beverage containers
-  Frozen juice & food bags

Rinse clean and dry! You don't have to remove labels from cans or containers.

Organics (Green Cart)

-  All food waste
-  Meat, fish, dairy
-  Paper towel
-  Coffee filters & tea bags
-  Leaf & yard waste
-  House plants
-  paper plates, napkins
-  Wooden & bamboo cutlery

Garbage (Clear bags only)

-  All pet waste
-  Diapers, incontinence, hygiene products
-  Broken toys
-  Q-tips & toothbrushes
-  Binders
-  Furniture (not wood)
-  Mattresses
-  Broken glass (sealed box)
-  K-pods
-  Old reusable bags

Use clear bags only!
No feed bags or dog food bags as garbage bags.
